

Money Market Fund – Quadrus Series

What does the fund invest in?

The Fund seeks to maximize income, while preserving capital and maintaining liquidity, by investing primarily in Canadian money market securities. The Fund seeks to maintain a constant net asset value of \$10 per unit. It may hold up to 30% of its assets in foreign investments.

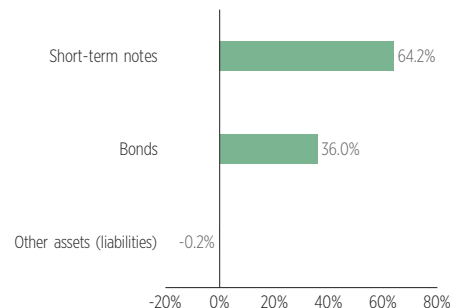

How risky is it?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

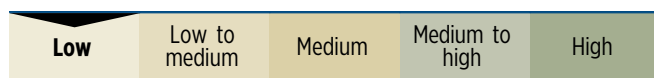
One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk rating

Mackenzie has rated the volatility of this fund as **low**.

This rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

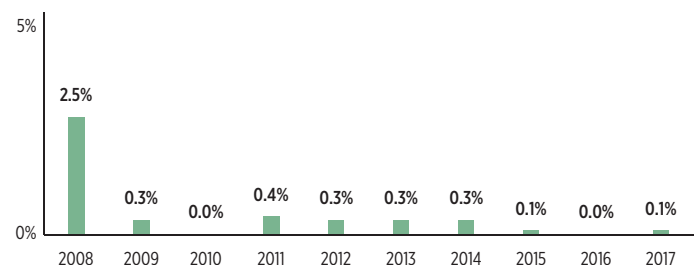
Like most mutual funds, this fund doesn't have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

How has the fund performed?

This section tells you how Quadrus Series securities of the fund have performed over the past 10 years. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce returns.

Year-by-year returns

This chart shows how Quadrus Series securities of the fund performed in each of the past 10 years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the fund will perform in the future.



Best and worst 3-month returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for Quadrus Series securities of the fund in a 3-month period over the past 10 years. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

Average return

A person who invested \$1,000 in Quadrus Series of the fund 10 years ago would have had \$1,035 as of April 30, 2018. This is equal to an annual compounded return of approximately 0.3%.

Who is this fund for?

Investors who:

- are looking for a money market fund to hold as part of their portfolio
- want a short-term investment

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan, or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Quadrus Series securities of the fund. The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

We provide eligible investors with combined management and administration fee decreases on their eligible Mackenzie fund investments, as disclosed under the sub-heading “Fund expenses”. We will automatically switch your Quadrus Series securities into L Series securities of the Fund (bearing lower combined management and administration fees) upon your investment amount in eligible Mackenzie funds meeting the L Series eligibility requirements of \$100,000 minimum series investment and \$500,000 minimum total holdings. If you or your eligible accounts, as applicable, no longer meet the requirements to be eligible for L Series, we may automatically switch your securities into Quadrus Series, which has higher combined management and administration fees than L Series. See “Fees and Expenses” in the Fund’s simplified prospectus and speak to your representative for additional details.

1. Sales charges

You have to choose a sales charge option when you buy this series of the fund. Ask about the pros and cons of each option.

The redemption charge is based on the net asset value of those securities at the time of redemption. • You can switch to other Quadrus Group of Funds without paying a redemption charge, but you may have to pay a switch fee to your representative's firm. The redemption charge schedule starts at the time you buy your investment and will continue to apply if you switch to another Quadrus Group of Funds under the low-load purchase option.

2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund's returns.

As of March 31, 2018, the fund's expenses were 0.93% of its value. This equals \$9.30 for every \$1,000 invested.

Management expense ratio (MER) This is the total of the management fee (including the trailing commission) and operating expenses (including fixed administration fees)	0.93%

Mackenzie/Quadrus waived some of the fund's expenses. If it had not done so, the MER would have been higher.

The fee decrease from Quadrus Series to L Series is 0.10%.

3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch securities of the fund.

Fee	What you pay
Switch fees	If you switch between series of the Fund or to another fund within the Quadrus Group of Funds, then you may pay your representative's firm a switch fee of 0-2%.

More about the trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the fund. It is for the services and advice that your representative and their firm provide to you.

Mackenzie pays the trailing commission to your representative's firm. It is paid from the fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment. The rate depends on the sales charge option you choose.

- **Sales charge purchase option** – 0.25% of the value of your investment each year (\$2.50 per year for every \$1,000 invested)
- **Redemption charge purchase option** – No trailing commission
- **Low-load purchase option** – 0%-0.15% of the value of your investment for years 1-3, and 0.25% for each year after that (\$0-\$1.50 to \$2.50 per year for every \$1,000 invested)

What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual fund securities within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
